Related Little or no previous work-related skill, knowledge, or experience is needed. Experience: For example, a person can become a waiter or waitress even if he/she has

never worked before.

Job Training: Usually requires a few days to a few months of training.

Job Zone Two: Some Preparation Needed

Education: Usually requires a high school diploma or GED certificate.

Related Some previous work-related skill, knowledge, or experience is usually needed. Experience: For example, a teller would benefit from experience working directly with the

public.

Job Training: Usually requires a few months to a year of training. May also require an

apprenticeship.

Job Zone Three: Medium Preparation Needed

Education: Usually requires training in a vocational school, related job experience, or

specialized education after high school.

Related Previous work-related skill, knowledge, or experience is required for these Experience: occupations. For example, an electrician must have completed three or four

occupations. For example, an electrician must have completed three or four years of apprenticeship or several years of vocational training, and often must

have passed a licensing exam, in order to perform the job.

formal job-training courses.

Job Zone Five: Extensive Preparation Needed			
Education:	Often requires an advanced college degree, such as a master's degree or Ph.D.		
Related Experience:	Extensive skill, knowledge, and experience are needed for these occupations. Many require more than five years of experience. For example, surgeons must complete four years of college and an additional five to seven years of specialized medical training to be able to do their job.		
Job Training:	Usually doesn't require specific training. Candidates are expected to have gained the necessary skills and knowledge from prior work experience.

Task - In order of importance (most first)

Remove excess glue from joints, using knives, scrapers, or wood chisels.

Apply filler compound and coats of finish to floors to seal wood.

Guide sanding machines over surfaces of floors until surfaces are smooth.

Scrape and sand floor edges and areas inaccessible to floor sanders, using scrapers, disk-type sanders, and sandpaper.

Inspect floors for smoothness.

Attach sandpaper to rollers of sanding machines.

Buff and vacuum floors to ensure their cleanliness prior to the application of finish.

What tasks do Roustabouts, Oil and Gas perform?

Task - In order of importance (most first)

Supply equipment to rig floors as requested and provide assistance to roughnecks.

Clean trucks used in the fields.

Bolt together pump and engine parts.

Move pipes to and from trucks, using truck winches and motorized lifts, or by hand.

Dig holes, set forms, and mix and pour concrete into forms to make foundations for wood or steel derricks.

Lay gas and oil pipelines.

Walk flow lines to locate leaks, using electronic detectors and by making visual inspections, and repair the leaks.

Guide cranes to move loads about decks.

Dismantle and repair oil field machinery, boilers, and steam engine parts, using hand tools and power tools.

Unscrew or tighten pipes, casing, tubing, and pump rods, using hand and power wrenches and tongs.
